



Flood Warnings

The Nassau Bay Office of Emergency Management (OEM) utilizes many methods to both receive and disseminate flood warnings. Nassau Bay staff utilize the following to receive flood information and warnings:

1. Staff/Resident Reports
2. National Weather Service Weather Radio
3. Listserv Emails from NWS and Harris County Flood Control
4. INWS Alerts
5. NWS Chat
6. IPAWS/Wireless Emergency Alerts
7. Local News Media (TV and Radio)
8. Harris County Flood Warning System
9. Social Media

Nassau Bay, in turn, uses the following to disseminate flood information and warnings:

1. Swift 911 – Phone/Reverse 911 Notification System (calls, emails, texts)

2. Social Media (Facebook, Next Door)
3. Website
4. EAS/PIES (KUHF 88.7FM and KTRH 740AM)

The City of Nassau Bay always encourages residents to get their warning information from primary sources, such as Wireless Emergency Alerts and local news. However, if Nassau Bay residents and properties are in harm's way, we want to put out the message in case they did not receive a warning.

In the case an evacuation is ordered due to a hurricane, residents with disabilities, limited transportation, or those that can't care for themselves can be assisted by the City and State.
